ORGANIZATION TIP

by Krystyna Parafinczuk

How do you begin to plan events and schedule your responsibilities for the coming year? How do you keep track of deadlines — grant submissions and final reports, conference registrations, rental agreements, government reporting/taxes, press/media, etc? In recent meetings with professional grant writers and media and promotions organizations, the top two tools for planning and staying organized are:

16- OR 12-MONTH CALENDAR ... for the NEXT YEAR WHITEBOARD, GLASS, MIRROR or DRY ERASE PAINT on your WALL!

This year the Arizona Dance Coalition created a year-at-a-glance calendar with important dance dates indicated. (As I'm writing this, a quick glance at the calendar tells me it's International Dance Day— April 29). Schedule an event around a national or international dance holiday and the media may be more inclined to promote.

Whiteboards (and similar) allow you to create: 1) an image of your evolving ideas/workflow during meetings (don't forget to take a picture of it and email to your team), 2) an in-your-face reference on the fly (can be easily updated), 3) a list of 'deadlines' (leave them up), and 4) visible tracking of leads for donations, application status for scholarship students or new employees, and so on. Get a BIG one and make it visible. Color-code projects/responsibilities. It's satisfying and renewing when you wipe the board clean and start again.


