



With festivities and entertainment running throughout the day, this celebration of Brazil's Independence Day features more than 90 musicians, dancers and performers from across Brazil, Mexico and the United States, who will engage audiences with a program inspired by Brazil's diverse, historic and colorful culture.



This year's Brazilian Day pays tribute to the Afro-Brazilian music and dance from

the Northeast state of Bahia. The festival will feature various elements of live Brazilian music, dancers and performers in dazzling costumes, interactive workshops and a one-of-a-kind samba fashion show. 

Wynton Marsalis' Spaces combines modern dance

with big band jazz in a playful and wildly entertaining exploration of the animal kingdom. Performed for the first time (to sold-out crowds) in 2016, Wynton Marsalis' new dance suite is visually captivating. Marsalis and the orchestra are joined by the Astaire Award winning tapper *Jared Grimes* and the ground breaking 'jooker' *Lil Buck*, leaping, sliding, flipping, and tap dancing across the stage. Each of Spaces' ten movements corresponds to a different animal, from "King Lion" to "Bees, Bees, Bees," offering a dazzling array of sights and sounds that express the diversity, humor, and quirky majesty found in nature. The same two singular dance geniuses from the Spaces premiere—Lil Buck and Jared Grimes—reprise their roles, leaping, sliding, flipping, and tap dancing across the stage.

Lil Buck is a groundbreaking young dancer who has performed with Yo-Yo Ma, Madonna, the New York City Ballet, and Cirque du Soleil. Jared Grimes is a versatile tap dancer who has won the Astaire Award, choreographed for multiple Broadway shows and Cirque Du Soleil, and performed internationally with artists ranging from Wynton Marsalis and Gregory Hines to Mariah Carey and The Roots. Damian Woetzel, choreographer and retired Principal Dancer with the New York City Ballet, returns as director and choreographic consultant, seamlessly integrating the dance with Marsalis' musical compositions. Spaces is a one-of-a-kind collaboration that is both an ode to the glory of nature and an extraordinary display of human achievement.

The small cast, called "Modern Ballet of Mexico," began to work sporadically in the Chopin Room, making presentations with choreographed work created by Amalia herself. For decades, I used the term win rate when referring to my clients' grant award rates for the funding proposals and applications that I wrote for them (in part or total). The numbers used to calculate my annual and lifetime win rates were real and documented at an average rate of 90%. I kept copious annual tables of grant requests written versus grants requests won including the names of clients, the amount of the grant awards, and the awarding funders. However, in the past few years, there has been a rumbling among my grants industry colleagues about what truly constitutes a win rate and the urgency to stop using this term. In this presentation, I will discuss the reason the term win rate was used with potential clients and employers. I'll also discuss the grant industry's viewpoint on using the term win rate. Most importantly, I'll provide robust discussion on the bigger picture that encompasses our hard work behind the scenes and why the term win rate does not reflect or represent our professional dossier in the grants industry. Her clients have included small businesses, career, volunteer and combination fire departments; chambers of commerce, faith-based organizations, and units of government including; state and federal government agencies, school districts, and colleges; charter schools, social and human service agencies, hospitals, service associations, and Fortune 500 corporations. Dr. Browning has assisted clients and workshop participants throughout the U.S. in receiving awards of more than \$500 million. Dr. Browning is the author of 43 grants-related publications, including six editions (over 1 million books sold) of Grant Writing For Dummies™ (Wiley.com). She is also an international trainer and keynote speaker. In 2015, she was selected by the Centers for Disease Control NICRD division to conduct a five-day Grant Writing Boot Camp in South Africa for ministers of health and other top-level health directors from 23 African countries. Dr. Browning holds graduate and post-graduate degrees in Organizational Development, Public and Business Administration. She has been a grant writing course developer and online facilitator for Cengage Learning (www.ed2go.com) for 17 years. 



... for those first few weeks of class in a new dance season by Shannon Dooling-Cain

The first few weeks of class could be tough for new students and teachers. Fear, shyness, and insecurities can really interfere with a student's ability to 'listen, focus, retain, and perform.' Shannon Dooling-Cain, dancer, choreographer, educator and blogger, provides these fun, easy games to create a pleasant, enjoyable experience with lasting effects. They start in a circle -- 'the most democratic spatial arrangement where everyone feels equal, says Shannon.

- 1) Body writing use different body parts or all the same body part to write their name on the floor or in space!
- 2) Freeze dance freeze in the shape of one of the letters of their name! Suggest levels.
- 3) Action dances turn a favorite past-time activity into a dance utilizing: repetition, variation, inversion, levels, rhythm or tempo. Have the viewing students guess the activity.
- 4) Emotion check-in Conduct a pre- and post-class 'emotion' exercise. Have them make a shape representing their emotion/feeling. Are they happier after class?
- 5) Age phase create a phrase of movement using as many counts as your age. If you are 6, it could be easy; 65 not so much.
