WARMTH & RECOVERY TIP

Cold temperatures have arrived in Southern Arizona. Instead of turning to those same heavier tights and sweat pants, consider leg warmers designed to keep you warm and help you in the recovery process (and no sweaty crotch!). Apollo's K-Warmer (Kinesio) is revolutionary and they use sports technology to help dancers dance longer and stronger, keeping muscles warm without inhibiting movement. The fabric is moisture wicking, antimicrobial



and it *stays in place!* They can be worn over tights or to replace leggings. Kinesio compression provides support for the calves, shins, thighs (up to 26" in circumference), and knees. Compression helps enhance circulation, speeds recovery and reduces inflammation for aching legs.

I have three pair of the **Apollo Infinite Shocks** (calf height) and love them. They really work and do keep the feet warm without getting sweaty. I wear them even when I'm not dancing. Consider giving these 'K-Warmers' a try. \$40/pair + shipping and handling. You are worth it. Career or hobby, *warmth* and *recovery* are key in continuing to do what you love in a better way that is more kind to your body.
