The bar chart on the right shows us that where the most progress can be made in dance education we show the lowest participation — Pre-K/K. This is a 'situation' that needs immediate attention.



If you receive a W-2, you won't be able to write off business expenses!

If you receive a 1099, you will be able to write off expenses, but make sure your receipts from Costco, Marshalls, Amazon, Target, etc., clearly identify dancewear and other work-related expenses.

For studio and company owners, business deductions won't change.

Keep playbills and flyers to help explain deducting ticket receipts — just in case you get audited.
