



Chad Herzog named Executive Director of UA Presents







ORGANIZATION TIP - THE COMING YEAR ... THE COMING SEASON

Carving out time for projects requires thinking ahead, looking at the calendar and plotting deadlines! From there you work backward and block time to write descriptions, bios, press releases, social media posts, secure high quality images, work with graphic designers, and prepare a 'design' or 'view' for your work ... your project!
