



STRESS COPING TIP

Dance educators, studio owners, choreographers, arts administrators are great at multitasking. Some tasks are routine -- you can do them in your sleep. Others demand creativity and knowledge. Then there are those situations that require extreme sensitivity and empathy. But what happens when you are in a threatening situation? Do you run or confront? Can you think clearly and creatively, or can you only focus on creating as much distance between you and the 'threat?'

Being able to successfully handle a stressful situation - a threatening one - may depend on how much of your time is spent being 'positive.' Results of research have shown that those who spend more time in a 'positive state' are better able to control their response in a stressful situation because they can 'see' more choices (other than fleeing). They are also able to help others - so important.

"Shifting out of stress can even promote the discovery and development of your personal strengths and resources and make them easier to access during times of need," writes Ann Baldwin, PhD, Mind-Body-Science (Tucson). Here's a link to an article by Barbara L Fredrickson and Christine Branigan on the positive results of positive emotions -- amusement, joy, happiness, contentment, etc. It may help you be better.
