





# Why I dance... Pourquoi je danse...

#### **POSTING EVENTS TIP**

When posting events on all the various online calendars available to us, first consider why you are posting: 1) informing the community, 2) getting exposure, 3) ticket sales, or 4) donations? To accomplish any of those, you have to understand how



the online calendars work. SEARCH ENGINES on the web 'search for key words.' They search for information you supply them thanks to YOUR POST. The next step is making sure you have all the correct information—Who, What, When, Where, Why, and How Much. Another thing to consider, if you have control, is how your post looks. ADC's online calendar gives you lots of control over the appearance. Centering, colored fonts, bold, italics, adding images, etc. It's a state-of-the-art calender feature of the ADC website. It also has a special feature to enhance 'searches' - Yoast SEO (search engine optimization). It guides you through a process of adding 'key words' and suggests how you can improve your post's 'readability.' After an analysis, it will give you a list of problems. Sometimes they apply and sometimes they don't. Ultimately it's your decision if you want to take Yoast SEO's advice. Recommendations: posts should contain a minimum of 300 words and the 'focus keyword(s)' be in the description and title. NOTE: When you only insert an image /poster, and no descriptive text, there are no 'words' to search except for the name of the image. Might as well not even bother creating the post. One last point — if you have the opportunity to embed a hyperlink, do it. It removes a lot of unnecessary letters/words/clutter, and greatly improves
