


What we're looking for

Chandler High School Modazz - Winner C2 Choreography Competition

The Never Again movement, started by the survivors of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School shooting, has echoes that have spread across the country. Its youthful advocates, denied access to the ballot box by virtue of their age, are voting with their voices and their bodies, initiating walkouts and protests and delivering blistering testimonials. In the absence of any meaningful action from the deadlocked "adult" community, they are making their presence felt, including here at Chandler – where the Chandler High School Modazz dance group chose to demonstrate with their art.

With "Never Again" we were witnessing a work by young people who understood that this issue put their own lives on the line. From the Q&A, it was clear that many of them were moved to tears by a school shooting documentary that was part of their subject

research and, undaunted, resolved to translate that grief and fear into their performance. Sincere and compelling, their physical artistic expression moved the audience in way that the endless dialogue surrounding this issue could not.

If this is what high school "kids" are capable of on their own, we can look to the future with some hope for this world.

More reviews *here* by Les Joos. I am a writer and arts enthusiast with an enduring interest in the performing arts – of which I consider dance one of the purest and most enigmatic expressions. The most that I can hope for is that this work is, in some small way, useful. Les Joos





Art of the seal: Arizona honors high school graduates in music, dance, theater, and more By Rio Paynter, Wednesday, December 25, 2019, CRONKITE NEWS Arizona PBS

Arizona high school graduates who prove they have mastered the arts now can get special recognition on their diplomas. Gov. Doug Ducey last spring signed Senate Bill 1111 creating the State Seal of Arts Proficiency to honor the importance of arts in

molding well-rounded citizens. The Arizona Department of Education will award to qualified high school graduates beginning next May.

To qualify, the education department requires graduates to complete the requirements of a "proficiency pathway," which it describes as a "rigorous, standards-based and high-quality arts education course of study."

Recipients must maintain a GPA of 3.0 or better in all qualifying arts courses – dance, music, theatre, visual arts or media arts – or in career and technical education courses which involve 21st century application of the arts. That includes animation, digital communication, digital photography, fashion and interior design, film and TV production, and music and audio production. Recipients also must complete 80 hours of extracurricular activities in their chosen art track and complete a capstone project allowing the student to showcase the entirety of their arts knowledge and how those skills will translate to real world skills.

The seal will be designed by Arizona students in grades 9-12, with the winning design announced by the Arizona Commission on the Arts in March – Youth Arts Month. "Arts education in general is extremely powerful," said Dustin Loehr, director of arts education at the Department of Education. "It really contributes meaningfully to well-rounded education and teaching to the whole child." Loehr worked with stakeholders across the state to help turn their ideas into the seal. Districts across the state will have the option to opt in or out of the program.

'MAGIC WORDS' TIP

by Krystyna Parafinczuk

Have you ever wondered why some people get the results they want? Maybe they know the 'magic' words to use, how to say them, and when to use them, to bring about their desired outcome. **Phil M Jones**, author of **Exactly What to Say**, has trained more than two million people across five continents and over fifty countries in the lost art of spoken communication. The book is small, the fonts are big, and the read is quick. He gets to the point and provides examples of how to use the effective 'magic words.'

"Magic Words are sets of words that talk straight to the subconscious brain," writes Jones. "Using words that talk straight to the part of the brain that is free from 'maybes' and responds on reflex gives you a fair advantage in conversation and can result in you getting your own way more often."

In chapter 8 he suggests 'simple swaps.' I chose this example for you because I use it in my dance classes all the time. I ask my students, "Do you have any questions?" Don't you do that too? Jones suggests we do a simple swap and say it this way: "What questions do you have for me?" The first way suggests the student 'should have questions and may feel peculiar or even stupid if they don't.' The second, better way, makes it easier to respond because they can quickly say they have no questions (not a lot of deliberation), or you learn the specific questions that need answering.
